In the early 1700's, John White was granted a large parcel of land in the area known as Brookfield. This 600 acre farm remained in the White family, passed from father to son through 8 generations until it was purchased by Henry Salem in 1950. He and his brother, Dick, worked tirelessly together to restore the homestead, and in 1961 opened its doors to what we now know as Salem Cross Inn.

The name is a compilation of two elements; the obvious tie is to the Salem family name and the other is to the hexmark etched on the front door handle of the main house. This "cross-mark" was found throughout the Bay Colony and in the 1700's was thought to ward off "ye evils of witchcraft and diverse other manifestations of deviltry."

The original home is considered one of the finest examples of early American architecture with its remarkable, authentic, wide board pine floors, handmade moldings, oyster shell plaster walls and magnificent fireplaces. Each room is decorated with rare colonial artifacts, ceramics, fine furniture and collectables. One of the most intriguing and impressive of all is the 17th century roasting jack found at the fieldstone hearth in the Chestnut Room. It is the only known operating jack in America and used often at the Inn to roast the most mouthwatering prime rib.

Whether it is lunch in our Main Dining Room, an intimate dinner for two in our Peregrine White Room, or a casual experience with friends in our Hexmark Tavern, the warmth of history and good old-fashioned New England hospitality surrounds you.
